Heritage High School is located in Brentwood. California, approximately fifty miles east of San Francisco. Heritage High School, the third comprehensive high school in the Liberty Union High School District, opened on August 1, 2005. Bentwood's population is approximately 66,854. Bentwood, which was once considered a rural town, has become a suburban city, while retaining its agricultural roots.

The current enrollment of Heritage High is 2553 with 43% Caucasian, Hispanic 26.1%, 13% African American, 9% Asian, 11%, Filipino,1% Pacific Islander. 17.4% identified as socioeconomically disadvantaged. 3.8% are English language learners.

STAFF:

The Heritage High School staff consists of a principal, 5 assistant principals, 4 counselors, 1 targeted counselor,1 mental health counselor, 2 school psychologists, 1 speech therapist, 1 district librarian, 1 psychologist intern and 114 certificated teachers. The professional staff is supported by 73 full-time and part-time classified staff.

SPECIAL PROGRAMS

Heritage High School meets the diverse needs of students through its regular and special programs. Special programs include: Advanced Placement courses, Career Technical Education Courses, Special Education, Air Force JROTC, and 4 distinct academies which include Technology, Art and Entrepreneurial, Health, and Public Services.
