### **CLASS INFORMATION**

#### 1. Attendance:

Come to class on time. If you have something that prevents you from being on time to class, please let Mr. Mauro know in advance via email, Canvas message or Remind.

#### 2. Respect:

Respect is held in high regard in this class. This means that the following will not be tolerated in our classroom (both virtual and in person):

- a. Derogatory language regarding race, ethnicity, gender, sexuality, religious affiliation, etc.
- b. Profanity
- c. Negative Put-downs of others
- d. Negative Put-downs of yourself

#### 3. Zoom Etiquette:

Please following the standards listed below in the Zoom Classroom setting:

- a. Your first and last name must be used when logging in. A nickname is fine (Like – your name is “Alexandra” and you put “Lexi”), but pseudonyms (like Big Baller 92) are not. Once you have logged in, please **list your name as last name, first name** (Example: Mauro, Mike)
- b. Your screen needs to be on for the entirety of the class. If you are having a rough day (emotional/mental health, family, etc.) please let Mr. Mauro know via email, Canvas message or Instagram prior to class and you can have a blank screen.

- c. Your Zoom background (if you choose to have one) must be school appropriate and follow the “Respect” guidelines above. Please choose one background and stick with it. Constantly shuffling through custom backgrounds is distracting to yourself and others.
- d. Mute yourself when entering the Zoom classroom. If you have a question, please raise your hand or enter it in the full class chat.

4. Plagiarism & Cheating:

Please do not:

- a. Turn in essays that you have not written yourself (peer, Internet source). Your writing needs to be your own.
- b. Turn in work that you have copied off a classmate. I read everything you turn in, and I will know.
- c. “Divide and conquer” the work, send it in a group message, etc.
- d. Share test/quiz/essay questions in advance with peers in other periods.

If you plagiarize/cheat, you will be given a zero on the assignment, and will not be allowed to make it up, no matter how large or small the assignment is and your parent or guardian will be notified. If you choose to plagiarize or cheat a second time you will be given a zero on the assignment, your parent or guardian will be notified, and it will be reported to your den.

5. Absences:

If you know you will be gone from class for two or more days, please let Mr. Mauro know so that you can get the assignment in advance. It is imperative that you keep up with your class assignments. Also, all assignments and handouts can be found on Canvas.

6. Late Work:

Fully completed late work can be turned in for a maximum of 60% with the exception of verified, excused absences (illness, funeral, etc.) However, if something is going on in your life that prevents you from turning in work on time, **please let Mr. Mauro know**. He will work with you to ensure your success. We are living in uncertain times and flexibility may be needed.

7. Grading Policy:

Grades are weighted by these categories: **Classwork/Homework**: 40% **Assessments**: 60%  
Your grade is based on the number of points you have earned in the class, divided by the number of points possible. Extra Credit will only be an option if the student has **ZERO** missing assignments.
