


Our Mission: Freedom High School will provide a range of educational experiences for all students to acquire the key knowledge and skills to become critical and innovative thinkers who are college and career ready.

- 4. Provide multiple avenues for the community to participate in the education of our students.




Your student will randomly be placed in one of four core building communities.

B, C, D or E


Your student will experience a smaller, more personal educational community while attending FHS.


# Graduation Requirements

English:	Students must pass 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade levels	40
Social Studies:	a. One year of World History (10 <sup>th</sup> ) b. One year of U.S. History (11 <sup>th</sup> ) c. One semester of American Government (12 <sup>th</sup> ) d. One semester of Economics (12 <sup>th</sup> )	30
Mathematics:	Students must pass three years of mathematics with completion of Algebra through Geometry.	30
Science:	a. One year of Life Science (Biology or The Living Earth)     b. One year of Physical Science (Environmental Science,     Chemistry in the Earth Systems or Physics in the Universe)	20
Fine Arts <u>or</u> World Language:	One year	10
Physical Education:	a. One year of 9 <sup>th</sup> grade P.E. b. One year of 10 <sup>th</sup> grade P.E.	20
Health:	Students must take one semester of health education	5

# What is a credit?

- For each semester course your student passes they will earn 5.0 credits. Credits can also be referred to as units. Study Hall does not earn credit.
- To pass a class your student must earn a D or better. If you receive an F, you will fail the class, and earn 0.0 credits.
- Your student needs to earn 270 credits in specific subject areas to earn a Freedom High School diploma.



# How can my student be successful?

- Attend classes every day and be on time.

- Use their daily planner.
- Develop healthy habits.


# CSU/UC Admission Requirements

- A-G are the college eligibility requirements, they are different from High School graduation requirements.
- Refer to these courses if your student is planning on attending a 4-Year college after high school.
- Students must earn C's or better in these courses
- UC's are designed to accept top 12% of students academically and CSU's top 33%





\*Any courses taken in excess of the minimum required in any subject area may count toward the fulfillment of the College Preparatory Elective requirement.




## The CA State Seal of Biliteracy

• All students must complete 4 years of English and get a 3.0 or above overall GPA in those classes.

### OR

- Option 1: State Assessment: Pass the California Assessment with "standard met" achievement level in 11th grade.
- Option 2: Advanced Placement (AP) Assessment: Pass an English AP examination with a score of 3 or higher (AP English Language and Composition, AP English Literature or Composition, or AP Seminar).
- Option 3: International Baccalaureate (IB) Assessment: Pass an English IB examination with a score of 4 or higher.
- Option 4: SAT: Achieve a score of 480 or above on the Evidence-Based Reading and Writing section



## The CA State Seal of Biliteracy for English Learner Students

- ☐ English Proficiency Requirement for English Learners Only:
  - Must attain an oral language composite score of level 4 on the English Language Proficiency Assessments for California (ELPAC)


## **AND**

In addition to the requirements mentioned in the previous slide, all students must:

- ☐ Demonstrate proficiency in one or more languages, other than English, through ONE of the following methods:
  - O Complete a four-course study in a world language at the high school or higher level, attaining an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher in that course study, and demonstrate oral proficiency in the language comparable to that required to pass an AP or IB examination

### OR

- Option 1: Pass a world language AP exam with a score of 3 or higher
- Option 2: Pass an IB exam with a score of 4 or higher
- Option 3: Pass an ACTFL Writing Proficiency Test (WPT) and Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) with scores of intermediate mid or higher
- Option 4: District Approved Assessment: Pass a school district language exam that assesses speaking, reading, writing in a language other than English at the proficient level or higher




# AP Human Geography

- For students who want to take a challenging course, an Advanced Placement course called AP Human Geography is a <u>college level course</u> that is available to freshmen. This is in place of World Cultures.
- Students may take the AP Exam in May at the end of the course.
- Expect to spend 1-2 hours of homework per night for each AP class.



# Career Technical Educational (CTE) Pathways



- These courses will prepare your student for specific industry workforce jobs.
- Examples of jobs these pathways can prepare your student for: web designer, construction, art director, childcare worker, etc.
- When taking these courses, you are demonstrating College and Career Readiness.

- Physical may be uploaded to <u>www.athleticclearance.com</u> after June 1, 2025
- Parent signed CONFIRMATION SHEET from <a href="www.athleticclearance.com">www.athleticclearance.com</a> and upload to your registration.
- All physical physician clearance forms must be on file to participate in tryouts.
- Parent Driver & Student Rider Forms turned in to coach.
- Volunteers Coach Approval, TB Test, DOJ/FBI Fingerprints, NFHS Coaching Course, Concussion Course, Sudden Cardiac Arrest, Heat Acclimation Course, CPR and First Aid, Mandatory Reporting Training, Sexual Harassment Training.


