OFFICIAL SUMMER SCHOOL 2018 APPLICATION**

Please complete the attached summer school application and return it to your school site counselor. Keep this information packet for your reference. Be sure to sign all necessary attachments.

- WHO:** Presently enrolled (2017-18) 9th, 10th, 11th 12th grade students (12th = 2018 non-grads).
- WHAT:** All required academic courses for graduation, except Gov't. Econ and English 4, will be offered at Heritage High School. Gov't, Econ, English 4, will be offered as independent study through Independence High School for 2017-18 non-grads.
- WHEN:** **SESSION 1:** June 12th thru June 22nd, 2018
Deadline: Friday, March 16th, 2018 3:00pm
(1st semester courses only)
- SESSION 2:** June 25th thru July 6th, 2018
Deadline: Friday, June 8th, 2018 3:00pm
(2nd semester courses only)
July 4th School closed-Legal Holiday

- WHY:** Summer School provides opportunities for students to remediate FAILED courses (see page 2) or improve D grades (if space available). **Summer School is not MANDATORY; it is an opportunity. Students who attend Summer School should expect to be dropped if they do not comply with all attendance and behavior policies.**

ATTENDANCE: **Attendance is mandatory.** Each session (9 days) is equal to one semester. Students must Attend all 9 days of class (each semester) or their grade and credit will be jeopardized.
Board Policy- AR 6177--*Because summer courses cover extensive instructional content in a relatively short time period, consistent class attendance is crucial. Students who have more than 6 hours of absence may not receive credit for their summer session class(es) unless authorized by the Summer School Principal.*

PROCEDURES:

1. **Parents and students,** please review and complete this *Information Packet* and *Course List*, review the application for accuracy and sign the *Parent Agreement Section* (page 1), and *Behavior and Attendance Expectations* (page 3).
2. All applications received by the deadline will be processed in the order received and **prioritized by grade level (Juniors, Sophomores, Freshman).**
3. **Classes offered are subject to enrollment and teacher availability and may be canceled. Applications must have a transcript and Counselor's signature.**
4. Applications may be submitted to the following locations by the deadline:
 - Liberty High School (Student's Den Office)
 - Freedom High School (Student's Building Office)
 - Heritage High School (Student's SLC Office)
 - La Paloma High School (Secretary, Main Office)
 - Independence High School (Secretary, Main Office)

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FOOD SERVICES: The Summer School campus is a **CLOSED CAMPUS**. Students will not be allowed to leave campus during breaks or lunch. Food service will be provided on campus. Free/reduced lunch is provided for those students eligible. **Food service is not provided to students enrolled at Independence High School-Independent Study**

TRANSPORTATION: LUHSD shuttle service will be available for those students attending Summer School. Students will be picked up in front of Liberty and Freedom High Schools at **7:30 a.m.** and transported to Heritage High School. The buses will leave Heritage High School at **3:10 p.m.** and transport students back to Liberty and Freedom High Schools. **Students WILL NOT be picked up or dropped off at home. Transportation is NOT available to/from Independence High School for students in the Independent Study Program.**

DRESS CODES: District Dress Code (BP/AR 5132) will be strictly enforced. All clothing shall be within bounds of decency and good taste. Shirts and shoes are required at all times. Hats and sunglasses are not to be worn in classrooms/instructional areas. Wearing of any gang symbols, such as handkerchiefs, suspenders, belts, shoestrings, jewelry, jackets associated with group intimidation or gang affiliation is strictly prohibited.

BEHAVIOR: Students must fulfill the expectations listed in the student agreement. Parents/Guardians must support their child in these behavior expectations.

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STUDENT BEHAVIOR EXPECTATIONS

Students will:

- be on time to every class.
- respect and comply with all summer school staff.
- perform their personal best in class.
- follow school and classroom rules.
- respect the building and grounds, including assisting in a trash-free environment.
- refrain from engaging in physical/verbal confrontations and harassment.
- not possess or use dangerous objects, controlled substances, tobacco or related paraphernalia on or about school grounds. This would result in **IMMEDIATE DISMISSAL FROM SUMMER SCHOOL.**

Consequences: Students that do not comply with the stated expectations will be dismissed immediately.

ATTENDANCE

- Attend school daily. There are a minimum number of hours required for each class; **STUDENTS WHO MISS MORE THAN 6 HOURS PER SESSION MAY BE DROPPED FROM THAT COURSE.**
Board Policy- AR 6177--Because summer courses cover extensive instructional content in a relatively short time period, consistent class attendance is crucial. Students who have more than 6 hours of absence may not receive credit for their summer session class(es) unless authorized by the Summer School Principal.
- Be on time for school. **Teachers and/or Administration** will handle student tardies on an individual basis. **Excessive tardies, doctors's appointments, etc. may result in dismissal.**

FINAL EXAMS

- **All final exams** will be given in the last half of the day on the last day of each session (June 22nd and July 6th). **Requests to take final exams early will not be granted.**

DRESS CODE

- District Dress Code (BP/AR 5132) will be strictly enforced. All clothing shall be within bounds of decency and good taste. Shirts and shoes are required at all times. Hats and sunglasses are not to be worn in classrooms/instructional areas.
