



Why Take AP World?




- Stand out in College Admissions- Admissions officers know the student has experienced college level course
- Possibly Earn College Credits- Colleges may offer college credit, advanced placement, for AP Exam scores
- Build College Skills- AP courses prepare students for next phase of educational journey
- Earn High School Grade Bump: Students who earn an A, B, or C in class will earn a one letter grade bump towards their high school GPA




- In order to register to take the AP Test, students must:
- Register for each AP course on <u>myap.collegeboard.org</u>. Students should receive join codes from AP teacher
- Go to <u>aptsusa.com/libertyhs</u> and pay a nonrefundable deposit for tests
- If your student is not planning on taking test, submit an <u>AP Exam Opt Out Form</u>
- If you think you may qualify for a discounted test, please submit a request for a Fee Reduction
- You will be contacted directly by phone or email if you qualify.
- Both of these steps must be completed by October 30 to avoid additional fees and delays.

| Period Number | Title | Time Frame | Period Weights | Textbook Chapters |
|------------------|---|-----------------------|-------------------|----------------------|
| Period 1 | Regional and Interregional Interactions | 1200 C.E 1450 C.E. | 16%-20% | 7-16 |
| Period 2 | Global Interactions | 1450 C.E 1750 C.E. | 24%-30% | 17-23 |
| Period 3 | Industrialization and Global Integration | 1750 - 1900 | 24%-30% | 24-28 |
| Period 4 | Accelerating Global Change and Realignments | 1900 – Present | 24%-30% | 28-37 |

Historical Thinking Skills

- 70% of the AP exam will require students to analyze primary source documents, maps, diagrams, etc.
