

Expectations for On-Site and Remote Learning including Full Distance Learners

I am excited and a little nervous to be back in the classroom. I look forward to seeing you in person, but I will miss seeing your faces (or your ceiling fans).

Remote Learning (This is you at least half the time.)

- Every day matters. Each lesson will only be taught once. Zoom days are as important as room days.
- You are an important part of the class. You may be called on so please don't ghost us. Use chat to ask questions.
- Cameras should be on. Faces should be on screen.
- I expect that you will be on Zoom for the entire period most days. Any early releases will be explicitly announced, and the remaining time is considered work time for you.
- Please join with Zoom in the five minutes before class begins. If you are tardy, you may miss out on the first few minutes of class as I deal with in-person students.

On-Site Learning (Not applicable for distance learners.)

- Masks are mandatory for you, me, and everyone *any time* we are on campus.
- Please approach the room, enter, and get to your seat observing safe distancing guidelines. Think of it as going to Walmart.
- The seating chart will be displayed on the TV. You will occupy the same seat every day.
- There will be supplies for you to sanitize your desk and laptop before class starts should you desire.
- My plan is to stand and teach while practicing safe distancing. You will be using the laptop to access Canvas, but you will not be using Zoom in class.
- Please bring your notebook, some scratch paper, graph paper, 2 mechanical pencils with lead, and a calculator. Let me know if you need anything.

In-Person Tutorial Periods will be on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 1:15 – 1:50.

- Available only to students on campus that day by appointment through Canvas.

Zoom Tutorial Periods will be on Tuesdays, Wednesdays, and Thursdays from 2:00 – 3:00.

- Any student may join any day.
- Algebra: 2:00 – 2:30.
- Geometry: join after 2:30.
