Official Transcripts

<u>UC or CSU:</u> Neither system requires any transcripts at the time of application. As part of an augmented or supplemental UC or CSU review, some students may receive a special request for an official transcript. Refer to your UC or CSU To Do List or the UC or CSU Admission Handbook.

Private & Out-of-State Universities /Colleges:

Usually require transcripts at the time of application Most will also require a "mid-year" transcript, reflecting senior fall grades. Contact each institution for their requirements.

Official Final Senior Transcript: Once a student commits to an institution - only that individual institution will need the Official Final Transcript. A final transcript includes all four years of high school courses and grades, plus verification that the High School diploma has been earned.

How to Request an Official Transcript from HHS?

If you are 18 years of age YOU must complete the request, not your parent/guardian.

Under18, a parent/guardian MUST sign off on your request form.

FAFSA

Free Application for Federal Student Aid. The FAFSA is used for applying for federal, state and some institutional aid. To qualify, students apply online beginning October I at www.fafsa.ed.gov. The deadline to apply for state aid is March 2. Both student and parent will need a FAFSA FSA ID. Your FSA ID is your personal identification, used to electronically sign the FAFSA application, and it allows you to check the status of your online application.

CAL GRANT ENTITLEMENT

A CAL Grant is financial aid provided by the state of California that can be used at most California schools.

Student /Parent:

- Make sure that the name on file at HHS matches

 the student's Legal Name (Birth Certificate).
 Contact Heritage High School's Registrar at 925-634-0037 ext. 6009 for verification.
- 2: Complete the 2019-2020 Federal Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) by March 2.

School:

Heritage High School submits electronic GPA submissions to the state of California.

A minimum Academic GPA of 3.0 is required to qualify for CAL GRANT A. The GPA is calculated using 10 -11 Academic Grades ONLY!!!!

CSAC

The California Student Aid Commission will use the information from the FAFSA and electronic GPA submission to determine students eligibility for Cal Grant A. B or C.

CSS PROFILE

College Board's College Scholarship Service is an online application for nonfederal financial aid from almost 400 colleges and school programs.

Check with your college/programs to determine whether they require the CSS PROFILE.

These official documents should reflect the Student's Legal Name, as it appears on the student's Birth Certificate or be able to provide legal documents that states otherwise, if needed. It is also important to use the same address.

SENIOR COLLEGE CALENDAR

AUGUST/SEPTEMBER: Make a list of college that you want to apply to and research Majors and application requirements. Register for SAT/ACT's. Request letters of recommendations. Attend Senior Fin Aid Night 9/17.

OCTOBER: FAFSA filing period opens Oct. Ist. File for a FSA ID at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Most colleges require that you complete the FAFSA to qualify for college aid. Verify your Legal Name with HHS for Cal Grant Entitlement. You can check your Cal Grant status at mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov

NOVEMBER: Apply to colleges: state schools www.csuapply.edu, California Colleges www.californiacolleges.edu and for University of California www.universityofcalifornia.edu. Most applications are due by November 30th. Contact the testing company to send your SAT, ACT, and SAT II scores to colleges that you are applying to. Local Scholarship Applications become available on November 15th.

DECEMBER: Check deadlines for mailing applications to private colleges. Last date for Fall Term Freshman to take the SAT, ACT and SAT II.

JANUARY: Continue to research and apply for scholarships. Local Scholarship Applications due, Jan. 24th by 4PM.

FEBRUARY: Check with the Career Center for LMC admissions workshop and assessment dates.

MARCH: 2nd is the last date to file the FAFSA for CAL Grant Entitlement. Students attending a CSU need to register for placement testing (EPT/ELM). Follow up on housing requirements.

APRIL: Expect to hear from colleges by mid–April. You can check your Cal Grant status at mygrantinfo.csac.ca.gov

MAY: Submit your intent to enroll at your college of choice, by May 1st. Plan to attend Scholarship Night on May 154h and the Award Night on May 30th Request Official final transcripts www.docufide.com

JUNE: Graduation - June 6th
