



Me gusta... I Like...

Me encanta... I love... you use just like gusta

Use the expression Me gusta followed by a noun to say that you like something in Spanish. Literally, it means, "It is pleasing to me [the noun]."

Me gusta can also be used in front an infinitive verb to state "I like to [do something]."

Examples: Me gusta el dulce. I like candy.
Me gustan los perros. I like dogs.
Me gusta viajar. I like to travel.

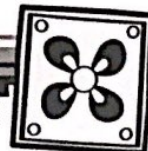
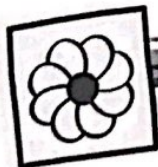


^{I.O.P.'s}
