
Our Mission: Freedom High School will provide a range of educational experiences for all students to acquire the key knowledge and skills to become critical and innovative thinkers who are college and career ready.

Your student will randomly be placed in one of four core building communities (B, C, D or E).



What is a credit?

- For each semester course your student passes they will earn 5.0 credits. Credits can also be referred to as units. Study Hall does not earn credit.
- To pass a class your student must earn a D or better. If you receive an F, you will fail the class, and earn 0.0 credits.
- Your student needs to earn 270 credits in specific subject areas to earn a Freedom High School diploma.



CSU/UC Admission Requirements

- A-g are the college eligibility requirements, they are different from High School graduation requirements.

- Students must earn C's or better in these courses
- UC's are designed to accept top 12% of students academically and CSU's top 33%





The CA State Seal of Biliteracy

- All students must complete 4 years of English and get a 2.0 or above overall GPA in those classes.
- All students must get a 3 'Proficient'or higher on the SBAC test taken junior year.

And one of the following:


- Complete up to level 4/AP and have a 3.0 or higher in the language they are taking (Spanish or French).
- Complete Spanish for speakers I or II, Spanish 4 or AP with 3.0 overall GPA or higher.
- Complete Spanish 1,2,3,4 or AP with a 3.0 overall GPA or Higher.
- Pass the AP exam with a 3 or higher.

AP Human Geography

- For students who want to take a challenging course, an Advanced Placement course called AP Human Geography is a <u>college level course</u> that is available to freshmen. This is in place of World Cultures.
- Students must take the AP Exam in May at the end of the course.
- Expect to spend 1-2 hours of homework per night for each AP class.

Important Information for parents and students:

The recommendation at FHS is that all freshmen students take a study hall period. We have found that an eight period schedule which includes a study hall period greatly increases overall student success in high school math placement will be determined based on the results of an algebra readiness test; current math class grade and performance; and math teacher recommendation. If you object to your student's math placement, your student can challenge the placement at the beginning of the school year by taking a readiness test to determine appropriate placement. Regardless of what math course your student starts with; if they earn a satisfactory grade, all students are able to meet the requirements for acceptance to college after high school.

World language courses are required for acceptance to a four-year college; a world language **or** fine arts class is required for high school graduation. Students who wait until their sophomore year to take a World Language can still meet all requirements for college acceptance. Students who are interested in earning the Seal of Biliteracy should enroll in a world language all four years and refer to the course catalog for eligibility requirements.

Colleges look at the quality of grades, not the quantity of classes. It is important to do well and earn a grade of C or better for college admissions. Students have four years to take the classes required for college acceptance. Our schedule allows for students to have plenty of opportunity to take a variety of courses during their high school years.

It is very stressful for a student to have a schedule change once the year begins. We plan how we offer courses based on course sign ups. Often times, changing one class can result in numerous changes to a student's schedule.

Activating Your Parent Portal Account


•You will receive an email in mid-July notifying you to activate your Parent Portal account. Accounts are not available before you receive notification.
