I would highly recommend, all students join our class RemindApp group. I will send out reminders of assignments, due dates, and office hours. You can also contact me with questions that way as well. All class codes are located on my teacher page on the HHS website.

I will have daily email "office hours" where I will quickly respond to emailed questions or concerns about projects, assignments or grades. This will be daily M-F from 8am-9:30am. You may email me with questions outside of those hours, however it may take me a bit longer to reply to inquiry. When you email me please put your First and Last Name, along with your period number somewhere in the email! If you don't put your name I have no way of knowing who it is.

I will also be holding weekly optional zoom meetings. Zoom is a video conferencing platform for us to communicate. You may log on and video chat to get help on assignments, ask questions, or just hang out with me and say hello (I get bored during quarantine too). Each week, I will have the meeting day, time, and link posted to the welcome page. If you are using your phone, you must have the zoom app downloaded for the link to work. Assignments will usually include an analyzing art assignment, a few bell works or smaller assignments, and parts of a comprehensive project to complete.

The analyzing art assignment should take you no more than 20 minutes to complete and no less than 10 minutes. We have done this in class as groups rather than individually. When analyzing art, don't forget to ask why. Why is the artist making this piece, why are they using specific colors, why are they using perspective. And how. How does their technique influence they way the piece is viewed? For those of you who are already planning on Googling what the piece is about, I'm one step ahead of you. When you submit your work to <a href="turnitin.com">turnitin.com</a>, it checks your work for plagiarism. It will tell me if you copied and pasted from a website, or if you and a friend have the same thing written on your assignment. Plagiarism policy is in effect. If you are caught cheating, you get a zero. If you and your friend copied off each other, you both get a zero. No exceptions, no make ups.



Draw the perfect Deli Sandwich


Make a list next to your drawing of everything that is in it

# Directions for the 1pt. Perspective Room Drawing

For this room project you will be drawing a room in perspective. Everything you draw in the room must be done in perspective. You must color your drawing using both colored pencils and markers.

#### Step 1.

Draw Horizon Line and place vanishing point in the center.




### Step 2:

Draw lines from corners of paper to vanishing point.

### Step 3:

Draw a rectangle using the corner lines for your corners.



## Step 4:

Erase horizon line (but not VANISHING point!) and all lines on back wall.

## Step 5: (ALL MUST BE DRAWN IN PERSPECTIVE)


Furnish your room with the following (this is the minimum – adding more furnishings will help your drawing):

- 4 pieces of furniture
- 1 window
- 1 door
- A rug
- A lamp
- A picture (poster) on wall
- 4- details (lamp, phone, alarm clock, shoes, clothing, etc.


\*Include all details to make the room as realistic as possible (plants, folds in material, textures, etc.)


## Couch or chair

Start with shape



- -Make guidelines from corners to vanishing point
- -Finishing far end with lines parallel to front \_\_\_\_ shape
- -Add Rounded edges; folds in material; cushions; arms; pillows; etc. for realism.







## BED:

- -Start with

Corners to vanishing point.

- -Finish back edge parallel to front
- -Add bedding: blankets, pillows, Bedspread, etc. (Hint; Round corners and soften line edges.)





Grading Rubric for One point perspective drawing assignment (80 pts. Total for project)  Total:/80
1 – Room has a minimum of four pieces of furniture. (Chair, tables, bed, bookshelf, couch, etc.) (5pts each)
2 – Sense of perspective is drawn accurately (lines are vertical, or aim for the vanishing points correctly)/10
3 – Composition includes a variety of stylistic details beyond "bare minimum. Room includes details listed in the handout to create a realistic believable room such as:
<ul> <li>Pictures on the wall, rugs, posters, lamps, windows, etc.</li> <li>Plants, light switches, molding, patterns, textures on surfaces and furniture</li> </ul>
4 – Design is complex and challenging, appropriate for high school skill level. Coloring shows controlled (smooth) shading. Drawing looks complete (no white background showing) and neatly done (no "erased" pencil lines showing) carefully handled, endues and corners are intact, not wrinkled, torn, stained, folded, etc. (5pts) / 20
