

Reclassification to Fluent English Proficient (R-FEP)

The goal of the ELD program is to reclassify EL students. Reclassification means that a student has met the District's criteria for Reclassification. This step indicates that an EL student no longer needs support and can be successful without further EL intervention.

1. Criteria for R-FEP
 - a. A student must be at a CELDT level Advanced or Early Advanced.
The CELDT score used must be for the current year.
 - b. All grades in core subjects for the current grading period must be C or better.
 - c. The student must have passed the language arts section of the CST with a 350 **OR** passed the language arts section of the CAHSEE.
2. Once a student meets all of the criteria, a letter is sent home informing the parents of the student's status and asking for their permission to reclassify their student. Once that permission is granted, the student is reclassified.
3. Then, the state requires that we track the student's grades for 2 school years to be sure that they are succeeding. If the R-FEP student fails a class required for graduation, we are required to notify the student's counselor, the student and the student's parents that remedial action needs to take place.
4. Reclassification is one measure used by the state to determine the success of an ELD program.
