- ✓ Check daily announcements for College "to do list" reminders & find out which college representatives will be visiting.
- ✓ Visit the HHS College & Career Center or website – for financial aid, scholarships, college/major search & other resources.
- ✓ Stop by the College & Career Center for Career resource material.
- ✓ Attend College & Career Workshops and Guest Speaker Presentations.

AUGUST

- ☐ Make a list of college characteristics that are important to you; i.e. regions of the country, cost, school that offers pre-med, etc. Check the college catalogs available in the College & Career Center or utilize these search websites: www.universityofcalifornia.edu, www.calstate.edu, www.californiacolleges.edu, <https://bigfuture.collegeboard.org/> & www.collegiatechoice.com
- ☐ Check college requirements. Make sure you have fulfilled the necessary requirements for the college you plan on attending. If you plan on playing collegiate sports be sure to check your Core Course Completion. **Eligibility check list, available in the College & Career Center**
- ☐ Take the necessary entrance exams for college: SAT or ACT.
Tests should be taken by **December**. REMEMBER TO REGISTER BY THE DEADLINE.

Military or Vocation

- ☐ Visit the College & Career Center for information and contact numbers and sign-up for ASVAB test.

SEPTEMBER

- ☐ Make a list of all your accomplishments, achievements, & community service while in high school. This is valuable information for college and scholarship applications.
- ☐ Attend District College Night September 25, 2025 at 6:00pm at Liberty High School
- ☐ If you wish to OPT out of the Cal Grant, please notify the College and Career Center ASAP.
- ☐ Review private/out of state institutions' web sites for application process and timeline.
- ☐ Letters of Recommendation are required with some college applications & scholarships. Utilize the Teacher Recommendation Request form, found on the HHS College & Career Center website. (Provide a minimum of two week's notice.)
- ☐ Register in the College & Career Center for ASVAB testing, visit College & Career Center for test dates.
- ☐ Begin final edit of your UC Personal Insight Questions, Link to the prompt: <http://admission.universityofcalifornia.edu/how-to-apply/personal-questions/>
- ☐ Look for institutional scholarships for each college that you apply to. **Register at www.fastweb.com**
- ☐ Find out which financial aid application your college requires? FAFSA or CSS Profile.
- ☐ Attend Senior Financial Aid Night for parents and students. **Dates TBD.**

OCTOBER

- ☐ File for a FSA ID with WWW.FAFSA.ED.GOV for students and parents.
- ☐ Apply on-line for the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) Application @ www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- ☐ California State University, apply on-line at www.calstate.edu/apply Application submission period 10/1 - 11/30.

NOVEMBER

- ☐ University of California, apply on-line to the University of California (UC) during the month of November www.universityofcalifornia.edu UC Application submission period 11/1 - 11/30. Application opens in August.
- ☐ **If you have not done so, send your SAT or ACT test scores to the colleges. Requests can be made online at www.collegeboard.com or at www.actstudent.org .** If you request your official SAT/ACT score report and have it sent to one campus, your scores will automatically be release to **ALL** CSU/ UC campuses to which you applied.
- ☐ **Create your college portal account.** Check your college communication emails and **READ THEM** - follow the directions given.

DO NOT PAY for a FAFSA application to be processed.

DECEMBER

- ☐ Check deadlines for mailing applications to private colleges.
December is the last month for most Fall term College Freshman to take the SAT and ACT (verify with your institution).

JANUARY

- ☐ If you haven't done so already, complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**) Application @ www.fafsa.ed.gov.
- ☐ Check College/University Housing requirements, you may need to apply now!
- ☐ Search for Scholarships and apply!

FEBRUARY

- ☐ Check your FAFSA applications to ensure they have been properly completed before the DEADLINE.
Keep a copy of your FAFSA form. Track your Cal Grant at www.webgrants4students.org

MARCH

- ☐ Cal Grant Application closes. Be sure you have completed the FAFSA. Heritage H.S. will electronically submit Cal Grant GPA Verifications for all seniors.

APRIL

- ☐ Expect to hear from colleges by mid-April. Students should tell their counselors and the College & Career Center Coordinators about college acceptance and scholarship successes. Information is published in the Scholarship and Commencement Programs.
- ☐ Register to take the required College Assessment Test.

MAY

- ☐ 4 year college bound students; complete your intent to Enroll by 5/1.
- ☐ Graduates attending a 4-year institution need to request a final transcript to be mailed.
- ☐ NCAA & NAIA Athletes need to send final transcript for approval.
- ☐ Scholarship Night - (Invite ONLY) and Senior Award Night - (Invite Only)

JUNE

- ☐ Graduation: June 4, 2026. Congratulations, Heritage High School Graduate!



COMMON QUESTIONS

- Are there scholarships for junior college as well as a 4 year college? YES – you can find out more by visiting the college's Financial Aid Office.
- Can the Local Scholarships be used at a junior college? YES – you never know what you can get, until you apply.
- If I go to a junior college, do I need to complete the FAFSA? YES – there are grants and waivers available.
- My parents make too much money, should I still complete the FAFSA? YES – let FAFSA make that decision, there are so many factors involved.
- Do colleges really look at my social media profiles? YES – be careful what you post, it never goes away.
- Can a college rescind my acceptance? YES – your acceptance is contingent upon how you finish high school.
- Are all college admission processes the same? NO – so keep track of deadlines.
