
The new Golden State Teacher Grant (GSTG) provides up to \$20,000 in financial aid to eligible students enrolled in a Commission on Teacher Credentialing (CTC) approved teacher preparation program within an accredited California institution of higher education on or after January 1, 2020.

If awarded a Golden State Teacher Grant of twenty thousand dollars (\$20,000), students must commit to teaching in a high need field at a priority school.





Foster Youth

Answer YES (mark the box) if at any time since the student turned age 13, he/she was in foster care even if no longer in foster care today due to:


















Common FAFSA Mistakes

- · Not reading definitions and instructions carefully
 - · Legal Guardianship
 - Parent
 - · Head of Household Status
 - · Number of Family Members (Household)
 - · Number of Children in College
- · Inputting information
 - · Confusing student and parent questions
 - · Name & Date of Birth and trying to correct them

2020 CASFA

Common FAFSA Mistakes

- Listing only one college to receive FAFSA data
- · Not using the IRS Data Retrieval Tool
- Not providing net worth of assets as of the date the FAFSA is completed
- Including assets that should be excluded (value of primary residence, retirement plans)
- 529 plans where to report asset, where to report distributions

FAFSA Concerns

- · Correcting Name or Social Security Number
- · Correcting Date of Birth
- · Selective Service requirements
- Completing the FAFSA after March 2nd (missing out on Cal Grant eligibility)
