- 1. Character Foil Precis: Choose a character whose words, actions, or ideas contrast with Creon's character. Explain how these conflicting motivations contribute to Creon's development as a character (that is, what traits of Creon's are highlighted through this foil character?)
  - a. Character Foil Choices (Choose one of these characters to write your paragraph about):
    - Antigone
    - The Guard
    - Haemon
  - b. Write one paragraph. Your paragraph should follow the Precis Format and include 2 pieces of textual evidence from the play. Use <u>this document</u> if you need a reminder of the Precis Paragraph Format. Paragraphs should probably be between 1-2 pages in length.
    - This year, we've been working on blending evidence with our set-up. Please do so in your paragraph. If you need a refresher on how to do that, you may see the notes here.
    - You may also review the <u>character foil notes here</u> for helpful information about how to think through your foil character, how they contribute to Creon's development, and how to approach your analysis.
  - c. Remember to look at the <u>grading Rubric on page 366 of your Springboard Textbook</u>. Your paragraph will be graded on the following criteria: Ideas #2 & 3, Structure #3, Language #3.
