1. Final Character Sketch: After seeing samples & practicing, now you're on your own! Choose either Romeo or Juliet and complete a character sketch on them for the final scene, Act 5 Scene 3.
 - a. Your character sketch should include the character's Actions, Obstacles, Desires, and Thoughts. For each of these four sections, make sure you include: (1) an answer (2) text evidence (3) analysis. If your character sketch does not include all of these parts for each of the four sections, you will automatically receive a score of 1 (Incomplete)!
 - b. Remember to cite from Shakespeare's original text!
 - c. Want to cite from a scene outside of Act 5 Scene 3? Email your teacher and let her know. She can help guide you to the text evidence you might need.
 - d. Your work should be typed
 - e. To turn in, you have a few options:
 - i. Download HANDOUT 1 from the assignment page. The Word file can be opened & edited in Microsoft Word or Google Docs. The PDF file is not fillable, but you can add text onto it in Adobe.
 - ii. OR, Create your own character sketch using the program of your choice. Just make sure to save it as a Word Doc, Google Doc, or PDF so that it can be submitted online.
 - Are you artistic? We would love to see your rendering of the character! You may draw your character instead of uploading an online image. However, your work should still be typed on a Word or Google doc in order to be uploaded to Turnitin.com.
 - f. Due on **Turnitin.com** by 9:00 A.M. on Monday, June 1st.
