

Chris Bodishbaugh Athlete / Baseball – Football - Basketball

hris Bodishbaugh attended Freedom High School from 1999 until 2003. During that time he established himself as one of the premier athletes ever to play sports in the Liberty Union High School District. As a result of his efforts, he is the first athlete from Freedom High School to be inducted into the Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame. Chris was a three-sport athlete who followed his dream to become a major league baseball player. He is the first athlete from Freedom High School to accept a full scholarship from a Division I School. He is also the first to be selected in the pro baseball draft out of high school.

In high school Chris did not play football on the frosh level choosing to play with the East County Lions where he had a stellar year. As a sophomore, he was the Offensive Player of the Year for the Falcon's J.V. team. In his junior season, he split time at quarterback and receiver earning his varsity letter. As a senior, Chris was chosen All-B.V.A.L. and All Contra Costa Times in 2000. He threw for 1,282 yards and 13 touchdowns with just four interceptions. In basketball, Chris was the Most Valuable Frosh Player in 1999. He then went on to carn two varsity basketball letters as a sophomore and junior. He chose not to play basketball his senior season. As a frosh baseball player, Chris was the J.V. Most Valuable Player. He lettered in varsity baseball as a sophomore and junior, but in his senior year he had an outstanding season that capped a brilliant four-year career. Chris was selected as his team's Most Valuable




Player, All-B.V.A.L. 1^M Team, the B.V.A.L. Most Valuable Player, and 1^M Team All-State. He had a 92 mph baseball, a 6-5 record, 2.00 ERA, one save, 20 walks and 82 strikeouts in 70 innings. At bat, Chris had a .341 batting average for 82 at bats, with 28 hits, five doubles, one triple, one home run and 11 stolen bases. Chris played first base when not pitching. As a result of his outstanding senior year, Chris was honored by the Contra Costa Times by being selected Best of the Best 100 Athletes in the area.

Chris signed a football scholarship with San Jose State even though he had been drafted by the Florida Marlins because he wanted to play college football. If he had signed with the Marlins, he would have to give up that experience – a chance that would be gone forever even though major league baseball was his ultimate goal. Chris entered San Jose State in the fall of 2003 and played football his frosh year. He was selected as the "Hardest Working Athlete" on the team as a frosh. In the spring semester, the Spartans refused Chris' request to play baseball, so he withdrew from San Jose State relinquishing his scholarship and came home to Los Medanos College where he played baseball for two seasons, 2004 and 2005. Chris was the Los Medanos Most Valuable Player those two seasons as well as being chosen 1st Team All Golden Gate Conference both years. During the 2004 football season, Chris played for the Los Medanos football team and was selected as the Offensive Player of the Year and was selected to the 1st Team All Golden Gate Conference.

After leaving Los Medanos College, Chris went on to C.S.U. Chico and played one year of Division II baseball. He then signed with the Marlins and is now playing minor league baseball in the Marlins minor league development program. Last season Chris played for the Single-A Greensboro Grasshoppers. He is at spring training now waiting for his next professional assignment.

The Liberty Union High School District is proud and honored to induct Chris Bodishbaugh into the Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding athletic careers at Freedom High School, San Jose State, Los Medanos College, C.S.U. Chico and in professional baseball with the Florida Marlins organization.

Gregory Chappel Coach / Wrestling



reg came to Liberty High School in 1980 to restart and Irekindle the wrestling program. He was a dynamic young coach who had attended Fresno State and was teaching in the Brentwood Union School District. Due to the wonderful program started by Supt. William Bristow, many Brentwood Union School District employees were encouraged to coach at Liberty High School while continuing to teach for their district. During the first four years of Greg's reign as wrestling coach, he worked to establish a sound program base - club wrestling and the elementary school wrestling program. He was also able to surround himself with many outstanding gentlemen who loved wrestling and helped him with his project. For three years the program developed slowly but surely under Coach Chappel's guidance. In the 1983-84 season, the Lions won their first league title – four years after restarting the program. During the 1984-85 season the Lions repeated as league champions going undefeated - 6-0. The Lions, in 1988-89, won the league championship and placed fifth at the North Coast, a major breakthrough, and a peek at what was to come in the near future. The 1989-90 team was league champions again with a 15-1 record and went on to be the first boy's Liberty High School team to win a North Coast Championship in any sport. The Lions entered the 1990-91 N.C.S. Championships having graduated eight seniors from the year before and having placed second in the league to College Park. The Lions were in third place entering the consolation medal rounds, but they won 11 straight matches

including the finals to come out on top and win their second N.C.S. Championship. In 1991-92 the Lions again won the League Championship and won their third consecutive N.C.S. Championship. The Lions were not finished yet – they won League Titles and North Coast Crowns again in 1996-97 and in 2002-03. In the 2007-08 season the Lions placed third in the league with a 9-2-record, but they came back to win the North Coast Section Title for the sixth time and won the N.C.S. as Dual Meet Champions -3A. Coach Chappel's record is absolutely outstanding -16 League Championships in 21 years and 6 North Coast Section Championships.



Krista Houseman Athlete / Volleyball - Basketball

rista attended Liberty High School from 1998 until 2002. During those four years she became one of the most gifted athletes to ever perform for Liberty in volleyball. She played volleyball for four years with three years as an outstanding varsity letterman and made the First Team All-League each year. During those three years the varsity team went to the North Coast Section Championships every year. As a sophomore, Krista was selected as the Most Valuable Player at the Chico Tournament. She was a Brentwood Press Athlete of the Week and the Brentwood News' Scholar Athlete of the Year. In her junior season Krista was selected as the Most Valuable Player on the varsity team. She was also honored as the Brentwood Lions Club Scholar Athlete of the Year as well as being the Athletic Director's Academic Award winner with a 3.53 g.p.a. In the year 2002, her senior year, Krista received more accolades for her outstanding play and leadership. She was the recipient of the Volleyball Captains Award and the Volleyball Coaches Award. She was also recognized for her outstanding academic standing by being awarded the Athletic Director's Academic Award for earning a 3.86 g.p.a.

Krista also played basketball as a freshman and a senior. As a member of the varsity team her senior year, Krista showed her outstanding all-around athletic talent by being selected as the Most Valuable Defensive Player of the team. She was the second leading scorer on the team averaging 12.1 points per game. While playing high school volleyball, Krista was voted




on "Top 100 Prep Athletes" by the Contra Costa Times. She was voted "Best of the Best" in girl's volleyball by School Sports Magazine. She finished her senior volleyball season with over 700 kills and 10 blocks per game.

Upon graduation from Liberty, Krista accepted a full scholarship to Loyola Marymount University in Los Angeles, California. She also had full-ride scholarship offers from the University of Utah, University of Miami, and the University of Cincinnati. She was the first Liberty volleyball player to receive a full ride scholarship to a Division I school. While at Loyola, Krista was an outstanding player on a team that went to the N.C.A.A. Tournament all four years that she played. Krista holds the all-time season record at Loyola Marymount University for "Attack Percentage - .356." She also received All-Tournament Selection at the University North Carolina's Glaxo Smith Kline Classic in 2004 with 53 kills during the tournament. The head volleyball coach at Loyola Marymount University paid Krista a very high tribute when he said, "Krista is one of the team's most versatile players. She can play any position at the net. Krista is the hardest hitter I've ever coached in 15 years of collegiate volleyball." A fitting tribute to an outstanding athlete.

Krista graduated from Loyola Marymount University in 2006 with a BA degree in Liberal Arts. She lives in Manhattan Beach, California, where she is attending Paul Mitchell Beauty College.

Fred Kelley Athlete / Football - Wrestling



Fred Kelley attended Liberty High School from 1996 until 2000. In those four years he became one of Liberty's most 2000. In those four years he became one of Liberty's most outstanding two-sport athletes. In football, Fred earned his frosh letter in 1996 and won the Coaches Award. He lettered in JV football as a sophomore. As a junior, Fred became a force to be reckoned with when playing with the Lions. He had a stellar season running for 822 yards and 11 touchdowns. He was selected to the B.V.A.L., Second All-League Team and was honored by the coaches with the Varsity Coaches Award. At the beginning of the 1999 season, his senior year, Fred was picked as one of the Pre-Season Top Players in the area. He didn't let the press down! In the opening game of the season Fred ran for 254 yards against Freedom High School. That feat broke the Liberty High School single-game rushing record held by Steve Dal Porto set in 1965. It also broke the record for the most yards gained by an individual on opening night for the entire North Coast Section. Fred rushed for a total of 1,043 yards and scored 10 touchdowns during his senior season. He was selected as the Most Valuable Player, Most Valuable Back. and Captain, and was again recognized by being selected to the Second Team All B.V.A.L. Fred was also recognized All-Region by Prep Stars Magazine. As a result of his fantastic season, Fred was selected to the Contra Costa County All-Star Team that played the Alameda County All-Stars and beat them. Fred scored two touchdowns in the game and was selected as the team captain.

Fred was not only outstanding in football. He was outstanding as a wrestler for Liberty. As a sophomore in 1997-98, he placed third in league and qualified for the North Coast Section. As a junior, he placed second at the league level and again was a N.C.S. qualifier. During his senior year he really had a super year. He was league champion, a N.C.S. qualifier, won the Lou Bronzan Invitation Tournament and was selected to the B.V.A.L. All-League Wrestling Team. In the spring of 2000 Fred was selected The Yearbook Male Athlete of the Year.

After high school, Fred attended Los Medanos College where he played football for two years – 2000 and 2001. During the 2001 season, Fred was honored to be selected as team captain and Most Valuable Defensive Player. He was selected as All-State Player of the Week and was named to the Mid Empire Conference All-League Team. Fred then attended the University of Idaho where he was red-shirted for the next season. He decided to transfer to Sacramento State University where he sat out one year. Fred returned to the football field in 2004 playing for the Sacramento State Hornets for one year as a defensive end and linebacker. While working on his Master's degree, and finishing his teaching credentials, he has been coaching. He coached football as an assistant at Florin High School. For the past two years, he has been serving as the offensive graduate assistant on the football team at Sacramento State with special emphasis on coaching the tight ends.

Fred graduated from C.S.U. Sacramento with a BS degree in Kinesiology and continues to reside in Sacramento while finishing his Master's degree and work on his California teaching credentials.

The 1970 team won an outright championship in the East Bay Athletic League. The 1978 team was 13-7-1 and tied with Alhambra High for the league championship with an 8-4 record. The team played Alhambra High in a league play-off game at a neutral site. Liberty lost 1-0 in a pitchers' duel between Liberty's Mark Biddle and Alhambra's ace pitcher, Vince Albanese. Alhambra went on to represent the F.A.L. in the section tournament. The 1978 Foothill Athletic League was very well-balanced with all the teams capable of beating each other. The final standings were:

The team took third place in the Rio Vista Easter Baseball Tournament with a 2-0-1 record. After the second game was tied 3-3 through the 10th inning with Dixon High School, the tournament officials decided to do a coin toss to keep the tournament on schedule. Liberty lost the coin toss and went on to win the 3rd place trophy.

The 1978 team placed five players on the F.A.L. All-League Team:

Honorable Mention: Barry Schwitters Pitcher

The 1978 team had a team batting average of .254 for the season with Mike Morado (.420), Nick Capsaliaris (.369) and Hal McCauley (.333) leading the way. Capsaliaris led the team with 3 home runs. Mark Biddle and Barry Schwitters led the pitching staff throughout the season with Biddle throwing 66 innings with a 1.17 ERA and Schwitters with 60 innings and a 2.55 ERA.



John Rogers Athlete - Coach / Football

Tohn attended Liberty High School from 1966 until 1970. U During his four-year stint at Liberty, John became an outstanding football player and team leader. As a frosh, John lettered in both frosh football and frosh basketball, but it soon became apparent to all that his main desire and focus was on becoming an outstanding football lineman. He earned his JV letter as a sophomore and was constantly working on his technique. As a junior, John blossomed into an outstanding two-way lineman who was tough, fast, and aggressive and above all a very intelligent player. He was rewarded by being selected to the second team All-E.B.A.L. defensive unit. He was becoming a very integral part of the very outstanding offensive and defensive line. Thus, in the 1969 season John had become the quiet but tough and aggressive leader of a team that would go undefeated. He was chosen Co-Captain in 1969 and was selected All-E.B.A.L. 1st Team as both an offensive and defensive player. Always mentally in the game, John broke through on defense against Amador High School and stole a hand-off and rambled into the end zone to score and jump start the Lions who were struggling. The team went on to score 12 points total in the final six minutes to tie the game and gain the Co-Championship.

After high school, John attended Diablo Valley College and lettered in 1970 and 1971. He was the starting offensive guard in 1971. Upon leaving Diablo Valley College, John played and lettered for Linfield College from 1972 through




1975. He was selected All-Northwest Conference offensive guard in 1974 and All N.A.I.A. District II offensive guard in 1974 and All-Northwest (small colleges) offensive guard in 1974. As a member of the Wildcat football team, John played in the National Playoffs in 1975 and on two Northwest Conference Championship Teams in 1972 and 1975. John was rewarded for his stellar senior season in 1975 by being selected All-Northwest Conference 1st Team Selection, Offensive Line, Unanimous Choice and Little All Northwest All-Star, Offensive Line (selected by Pacific Northwest Sportswriters).

Upon graduating from Linfield College, John taught high school in three districts in Oregon from 1976 – 1994 and coached football with outstanding success. His teams played for three Oregon State Championships winning two in 1977 and 1981. He was selected for the prestigious honor of Oregon's East-West Shrine Coach in 1982. In 1982, he was honored by his Alma Mater by being inducted into the Linfield College "Coaches Hall of Fame." He was also the recipient of various Coach of the Year awards during his coaching career.

In 1994, John left coaching and high school teaching to become a school administrator moving to Page, Arizona where he served as an Assistant Superintendent for the Page Unified School District from 1994 – 1997. John left Arizona in 1997 and is presently the Superintendent of the Atascadero Unified School District in Atascadero, California. John earned both his Bachelors and Masters degrees from Linfield College and completed his Administrative Credential at Lewis & Clark College in Portland, Oregon and Cal Poly in San Luis Obispo. John and his wife, Teri, have two children - Heidi, who lives in Newport, Oregon, and is a teacher, and son, John David, who works in natural resource management and lives in San Bernardino County.

Matt earned his varsity letter in volleyball as a sophomore in 2001. As a junior and senior in 2002 and 2003, he again earned his varsity letters as well as being selected Most Valuable Player both years. He was also selected to the Bay Valley Athletic League All-League Team both years. In 2002 Matt was also a North Coast Section Distinguished Scholar Athlete. In May of 2003 Matt was recognized as a member of Volleyball Magazine's Fab 50 Selection. In June of 2003, Matt was selected as the Contra Costa Times "Athlete of the Year in Volleyball." He was also selected the Brentwood News Athlete of the Year. Matt was recognized for his leadership and academics during his years at Liberty. In the summer of 2002, he was American Legion Boy's State Attendee, and in 2003 he attended the National Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C. He was selected to "Who's Who Among American High School Students" in 2003. Matt was a member of the Academic Honor Roll every semester in high school with a final G.P.A. of 3.57.

After graduation from Liberty, Matt had the honor of playing with top U.S. junior teams. In 2003, he played with the Junior Olympics All Tournament Team in Phoenix, Arizona. He was named #8 of 20 players competing with Team Utah at the Moscow-Utah Games in Russia. In August 2004,

he played for the Junior National Team that placed second in Norceca, Canada, and in August of 2005 he again played on the Junior National Team that placed eighth in the World Championships in India.

Matt accepted a volleyball scholarship to the University of California Irvine where he played for all four years on outstanding teams in Mountain Pacific Sports Federation. He was selected to 2nd Team All-Conference in both 2006 and 2007. He was also named 2nd Team All-American for the same two seasons. But, that only tells part of the story. Matt led the U.C. Irvine team to the N.C.A.A. Division I Volleyball Championship in 2007 in Columbus, Ohio. He was named to the 2007 N.C.A.A. All-Tournament Team and was voted the Outstanding Player of the Tournament. Against Penn State in Irvine's semi-final game the 6'7" Webber had 19 kills. Matt then turned it up a notch and had 22 kills and hit .457 in the championship match against I.P.F.W. (Indiana Purdue Fort Wayne) – 41 kills in two N.C.A.A. tournament games! Other U.C. Irvine notables are 2004 Volleyball Hall of Fame Classic – All Tournament Team, and in 2007 the Scholar Athlete Award as well as the M.P.S.F. Player of the Week and National Player of the Week for April 30, 2007. He was also selected as the Most Valuable Player in 2007 at the Elephant Bar Tournament at U.C. Santa Barbara.

Matt has gone on to a professional volleyball career. In 2007-08 Matt led the Santa Sport to a Finnish National Title in Rovaniemi, Finland, and was named the Most Outstanding Player. In December of 2007, he was named the Most Outstanding Player at a tournament in Holland. Matt is currently playing for "GFCOA-Ajaccio Volleyball" in Corsica, France.


