

# **Rodney Beaver** Athlete ~ Coach ~ Athletic Director Football ~ Baseball ~ Soccer ~ Golf

The Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is proud and honored to induct Rodney Beaver into the Athletic Hall of Fame for his outstanding accomplishments as an athlete, coach, athletic director, teacher and contributor to Liberty High School, Los Medanos College and Cal-State Hayward. Rodney Beaver is a native of Eastern Contra Costa County who attended Gehringer and Brentwood Elementary Schools, Edna Hill Middle School, Antioch Junior II.S. and arrived on the Liberty High School campus in the fall of 1970.

Rod's athletic career at Liberty High School can be characterized as that of a hardnosed competitor and leader on the teams in which he participated. He lettered in JV football as a sophomore and moved up to the varsity level his junior and senior season, where he established himself as a standout two-way starter at tight-end and defensiveend. He was a multiple recipient of Brentwood News Player of the Week Award, and as a senior earned 1st Team All-EBAL honors as a defensive-end, as well as Lineman of the Year and Co-Captain team awards. Rod also played baseball all 4 years at Liberty High School primarily as a catcher, and he lettered in soccer his senior year. He also served as the Block L Society President, was a member of the student and youth councils and was an honor roll student while at Liberty.

Upon graduation from Liberty in 1974. Rod moved on to newly-opened Los Medanos College where he captained the first two football teams in the school's existence, which included the 1975 Camino Norte Conference Co-Champions. He was a leading tackler and earned multiple player of the week honors in addition to being selected 1st Team All-Camino Norte Conference at linebacker for both the 1974 and 1975 seasons. Rod then transferred to Cal-State University Hayward where he captained the 1976 and 1977 football teams, and, as a middle linebacker, called signals and was a leading tackler for the top rated defense in the Far-Western Conference, for which he earned ALL-Conference honors. Rod graduated with a B.S. degree in Kinesiology/P.E. in 1978.

In 1978 Rod returned to Liberty High School and embarked on his coaching career as a frosh football assistant. Subsequent coaching jobs from 1979-82 included a 3-year stint at Los Medanos College as a defensive assistant and a defensive coordinator position at College Park H.S. while student teaching there. During this time period. Rod was also a player/coach for the semi-pro Antioch Hornets Football Club and a twotime participant in the CFL play-offs.

Hired as a math teacher in January 1983 at Liberty Union High School. Rod began a 34 year (and counting) teaching and coaching career there. He has coached football as a varsity assistant or JV/Frosh head coach for the past 33 years, including 15 years as the varsity defensive coordinator. Coach Beaver's teams and position groups can be characterized as being well prepared, disciplined, fundamentally sound and competitive. He has coached numerous athletes who have earned post-season honors and have gone on to compete and excel on the collegiate level.

Rod also coached baseball from 1983–1995, the last eight years as the varsity head coach where he led several competitive teams including the 1993 DFAL champions, for which he was awarded League Coach of the Year honors. He has also served as an assistant golf coach since 2001, mentoring scores of students on the many intricacies of that sport.

His coaching and leadership ability led him to taking on the role of Athletic Director at Liberty High School from 1991-2000, where he oversaw the expansion of the program, transition into Division 1 classification, and realignment into the BVAL. Rod has also served as the PE Dept. Chairperson from 2001-2014. He continues to teach and coach at Liberty High School, where his wife Missy also teaches. His children, Brian and Shawn, also work in the education field and have so far blessed him with two grandsons, MJ and Caleb.

# **Kevin Harrity** Athlete Baseball ~ Basketball

Kevin Harrity took the Heritage campus by storm in the fall of 2006. As soon as he set foot on campus, he showed his innate desire to leave his mark and make a difference that future Patriots would strive to match. He immediately became involved in all aspects of school. He made the freshman basketball team and then proceeded to make the varsity baseball team, becoming the winning pitcher in the school's first ever BVAL victory.


But that was only the beginning! Kevin went on to make the JV basketball team his sophomore year and then spent the next two seasons terrorizing opponents throughout the NCS and BVAL with his toughness, tenacity, and unique ability to score from all spots on the floor. He earned two varsity letters in basketball, led a balanced team in scoring his senior year, and directed his team to the school's first BVAL Boys Basketball title in 2010. Along the way he was named All-Tournament at the McKinleyville Tip-Off Classic, won by the Patriots, and named 2nd Team All-League his senior year.

On the baseball diamond, Kevin earned a varsity letter in each of his four years. He was a three-time All-League selection culminating in being selected to the First-Team his senior year where he batted .357, scored 23 runs, had 25 hits and drove in 16 runs. He was also Captain of that 2010 team that won the school's first BVAL Baseball Championship.

Kevin did all of these things while taking a rigorous course of studies and maintaining a GPA of over a 4.0 during each season of sport. He was an NCS Scholar Athlete every season in both baseball and basketball and was a winner of the Athletic Director's Award each season that recognized athletic and academic excellence. He culminated his 4-year high school career by being named Heritage High School's Male Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

He was also very involved in Leadership and student government. He held the positions of freshman and sophomore class Vice-President, Head Commissioner of Athletics and was the ASB Vice-President his senior year.

After graduation, Kevin went on to Cal Poly San Luis Obispo and earned a BS in statistics with a minor in mathematics. While at Cal Poly, he continued his athletic career as a member of the Club Baseball team. He played first base and right field and was two-time National Club "Player of the Week." During his junior year, the team advanced all the way to Regional Playoffs. He is currently a licensed psychiatric technician at the Atascadero State Hospital.

The Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is proud and honored to induct Jessica Khalil into the Athletic Hall of Fame for her outstanding athletic careers at Heritage High School, Sacramento State University and for the Sacramento Sirens Football Team. Jessica Khalil had a mission while at Heritage High School: Do everything to the best of your ability, let no one out work you, and when you had succeeded move on to something else!

Her quest to define that mission began on day one. As you will begin to see, her time was consumed from August to June as she became a multi-sport athlete during each of her years at Heritage High School. This girl never took a day off! She played freshman volleyball, JV basketball and JV softball in her first year. During her sophomore year, she played JV volleyball and earned varsity letters in basketball and softball. That softball season, her team won Heritage High School's only NCS title, for which they were inducted into the Hall of Fame in 2016 and was an NCS Scholastic Championship Team.

Jessica continued to letter in basketball and softball in her final two years at Heritage but also found a new passion in the game of football. During her junior year, she became a wide-receiver on the JV football team and caught a touchdown pass. She went on to compete and earn a varsity letter her senior season on the football team that culminated in the NCS playoffs with her making a reception in the playoff game.

On top of the athletic accomplishments, she also excelled in the classroom! In every season of sport, she earned the NCS Scholar Athlete Award and the Athletic Director's Award for athletic and academic excellence. Following her senior year, she earned two very prestigious awards from Heritage. She was named the Tri–Sport Award winner that goes to any senior athlete that earns three letters during their senior year, and she was the 2009 Female Scholar Athlete of the Year.

Following graduation, Jessica continued her athletic career by earning a scholarship to compete at Sacramento State on the Women's Division 1 Rowing Team. She competed on that team through 2012, earning Dean's List honors and then switched over to women's rugby for her final season. She also found time to play women's professional football for the Sacramento Sirens, and her team won the Western Conference Title in 2012. She graduated from Sacramento State in 2015 with a double degree in Business Administration and Kinesiology/Physical Education and is currently working on her teaching credential. We look forward to seeing her use her wide range of skills to inspire young men and women through athletics and academics in the years to come.

# Stacy Perez May Athlete

### Softball ~ Volleyball

Stacy Perez May was born on June 10, 1971 and raised in Oakley. She started her education at Gehringer Elementary and Oakley Middle School before attending Liberty Union High School, graduating in 1989. During her years at Liberty, Stacy excelled in two sports – volleyball and softball.

As a freshman, Stacy started on the JV volleyball team and the JV softball team. As a sophomore, Stacy played varsity volleyball where she earned her Block "L." She was named "Most Improved Player." Stacy and her teammates made volleyball history at Liberty by making it to the NCS playoffs in 1986.

The sport that Stacy really excelled in was softball. At the end of Stacy's freshman year, she was moved up to the varsity softball team. She found a home with the varsity team and remained there during the next three years earning her Block "L."

In softball, she began to grow into her centerfield position as an offensive and defensive player. In 1987, she was named varsity team's "Most Inspirational Player." In 1988, Stacy was named "Top Defensive Player." To round off a great softball career in 1989, she earned both the "Golden Glove" and "Top Offensive Player" for the Liberty Lions.

Softball Coach Rich Barrios said of Stacy, "Stacy had all the characteristics of a true centerfielder, a strong arm and an uncanny ability to cover from left center field to right center field without much apparent effort. The characteristic that stood out the most when it came to Stacy's ability was her understanding of how she should react to the ball coming off the bat in order to make the play. Did she need to be overly aggressive and charge the ball, or did she need to sit back and let the ball come to her?"

Additional accolades in 1989 included being selected to the Diablo Foothill All-League first team. In 1989 Stacy was also named Contra Costa Times Athlete of the Week. In 1989, Stacy and her teammates took first place in the Diablo Foothill League and went on to play in the North Coast Section playoffs.

Following high school, Stacy began working for Dr. Gregory Castillo, a chiropractor in Pittsburg. She is currently the Office Manager. She married Tom May, and they have two sons. Stacy has remained active in softball and baseball coaching both her sons in the East County Little League program. You may catch Stacy playing on softball teams in the Oakley area.

# **1992 Liberty HS Lady Lions Track Team** Coached by:



The 1992 Liberty High School Lady Lions Track Team distinguished itself as one of the top track teams in school's history by winning the Diablo Foothill Athletic League (DFAL) dual meet and league meet championships. They went on to finish in the top five of the North Coast Section. Not since the 1978 season had a Lady Lions Track Team accomplished this feat.

The fifteen-member team bonded together under coaching legend Keith Dawson and assistant coach Mark Johnson. They finished second to Acalanes in 1991 (losing 79 to 72). The 1992 Lady Lions led by seniors, Andrea England, Tracy DeLany, and Ivy Turner tore through league competition with an 11–1 dual meet record. They avenged the previous year's loss by defeating Acalanes 76 to 71 in their dual meet to take first place at the DFAL. They went on to the DFAL meet at Diablo Valley College to capture first place. To accomplish this, each of the fifteen Lady Lions competed in multiple events (up to four each) th**roughout** the season.

**Six Lady** Lions went on to compete in North Coast Section competition: Andrea England in the 100, 200, Long and Triple Jumps and the 4 x 100 relay; Tracy DeLany in the 800, 1600, and 3200 meters; Ivy Turner in the 100, 200 and 4 x 100 relay; Christine Brockett in the Long and Triple Jump and the 4 x 100 relay; Lisa Bell in the 110 and 300 meter hurdles; **and Juli** Russell in the 300 meter and High Jump. Andrea England qualified for the Long and Triple Jumps, and Tracy DeLany qualified for the 1600 and 3200 meters in the Meet of Champions at the University of California, Berkeley.




