HOW TO DRESS FORMS

Vertical Dress Horizontal Dress Block Dress Curvilinear Dress

Vertical Dress

- Vertical Dress (cover)
- Cover front or back (whichever way you are facing)
- Play "peek-a-boo"
- Align the spine!
- Body center
- Use our dots on field
- Know your i.



Horizontal Dress

- Horizontal Dress (Cover) or "Side to Side"
- Use our dots on the field
- Body Center
- Dress point could be left, right, or center



Block (Filled Form) Dress

- 3 types of cover Front to back, Side to side and Diagonal
- Different sets will have different priorities
 - Usual process is Front first (move left or right) then Side (move up or back)
- Everyone MUST have Body center and be on Dots



Arc (Curvilinear) Dress

- Turn to face in the center of a closed form to "focalize" lining up the feet and shoulders
- No bumps...keep the form SMOOTH
- Make sure YOU CONTINUE the path of the arc

Rehearsal Process and Flow

Responsibilities

- Student
 Responsibilities
 - Music and coordinate memorized
 - Have coordinate sheet on person
 - LISTEN and WATCH for cues
 - Review drill to be covered that day BEFORE rehearsal

- Ensemble Responsibilities
 - Listen for instructions
 - Eyes on Drum Majors for visual rehearsal cues
 - Improvement in every repetition
 - Improvement in daily rehearsal etiquette

Information Process and Flow

- Visual comments and analysis given by Microphone staff
- Visual comments given by Field staff
- Music comments and analysis given by Microphone staff
- Instructions for next segment given...repeat process



Minus and Plus One

- When starting a drill segment, we always start from the PREVIOUS count or MINUS ONE (think of it as a pickup note)
- When finishing a drill segment, we always finish the set and ONE MORE count or PLUS ONE
- This goes for both music and visual
- This helps with change of directions, musical phrasing, form control and simulates the "real show" marching without stops
- At the conclusion of PLUS ONE, watch the Major and listen for Microphone staff for directions...DO NOT TALK

Rehearsing with Dr. Beat

- Beat will always come from backfield
- 8 clicks to prepare pulse subdivision
- Battery responsible for primary and subdivided pulses with beat
- Pit listen back to battery
- Drum Majors may not conduct due to time delays from backfield to front field
