LIBERTY UNION HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT BUS DRIVER

DEFINITION

Under general supervision, to drive a school bus or transportation vehicle over an assigned route in the transportation of pupils; to apply safe driving principles in vehicle operation; to maintain vehicle cleanliness; and to do related work as required.

EXAMPLE OF DUTIES

Drives a school bus or transportation vehicle on an assigned route in accordance with a time schedule; boards and discharges student passengers; assists in the safe loading and unloading of pupils and equipment; transports students, staff and chaperons on special trips; enforces district policies and procedures in maintaining discipline on buses; prepares daily reports of mileage, time and student load; maintains vehicle cleanliness on daily basis; performs minor bus maintenance checks and reports maintenance needs; may fuel bus; renders first aid or emergency assistance, as needed. Performs thorough bus safety inspection. When necessary meets with parents and school staff. Attends scheduled safety meetings. Reports changes and updates route maps.

QUALIFICATION

Knowledge of:

Safe driving practices and procedures.

California Motor Vehicle Code and Education Code requirements pertaining to pupil

Transportation.

Geography of the school district.

Operation of all District transportation vehicles.

Ability to:

Demonstrate good physical and mental health.

Safely and efficiently operate a school bus.

Maintain proper discipline among students on a school bus.

Keep simple records.

Understand and carry out oral and written instructions.

Maintain cooperative relationships with those contacted in the course of work.

Experience:

Three years of successful experience in the operation of automotive vehicles, preferably including some experience in the operation of heavy vehicles.

Education:

Equivalent to the completion of the twelfth grade.

License Requirement:

Possession of a valid California Commercial Driver's License and accompanying medical certificate.

Valid school Bus Driver Certificate.

First Aid Certificate, issued by the American Red Cross, or equivalent to American Red Cross Standards.

Other:

Must pass and maintain satisfactory results of the Post Offer, Pre-Placement Physical Evaluation Program (PEP). This physical strength test demonstrates a minimum level of strength to perform the essential functions of the job.
