 6. Complete record chart of participation and outside of school activities as thorough as possible. Do not think anything is not important, such as baby sitting. The committee wants to know about you and how you have spent your time socially or working.
 7. Contact counselor to fill out FAFSA (financial aid) form. Flier attached.

WHAT IS FINANCIAL AID?

Financial aid is money provided by federal, state, and institutional sources to help students meet expenses while attending college. Many students find it increasingly difficult to finance a college education without some assistance.

IF I RECEIVE FINANCIAL AID NOW, DO I NEED TO PAY THE MONEY BACK LATER?

Most financial aid is money that doesn't have to be repaid. Grants and scholarships make up a large portion of financial aid received by students. If you apply early, chances are a significant amount of your financial need can be met with aid that doesn't have to be repaid.

Types of financial aid available:

- The Board of Governors Enrollment Fee Waiver (BOGW) This program waives enrollment fees for qualified students for the entire school year.
- Grants are a form of financial aid that does not have to be paid back (unless you withdraw from school and owe a refund).
- Scholarships are a form of financial aid based upon specific qualifications, talents, or merit, often without regard to financial need.
- Work-Study Programs allow students to earn money for their education by working part-time either on campus or off campus.
- Loans for financing your education are available from a variety of programs, including Subsidized Stafford Loans, Unsubsidized Stafford Loans, and PLUS Loans. These have to be repaid so make sure you talk to your school's Financial Aid Office for a complete description.
 - ➤ To determine what funds you qualify for you need to complete the Free Application For Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). Your financial eligibility will be determined by a number of factors including family income, the size of your family and number of family members attending college.
- ✓ To complete a FAFSA go to: www.fafsa.ed.gov
 Applying online is fast and easy. It has built-in help to guide you through the application process. The application period begins on October 1st for the next academic year. It is best to file as soon as you decide to attend college. If you want to be considered for state grants, you must file your FAFSA by March 2nd.
- ✓ Get this stuff together before filling out your FAFSA:
