Hello and welcome back,

In the next few weeks you will receive a list in your box of your English Language students and their current levels based on last year's ELPAC score. If you are wondering what your student's language fluency and levels are here is the best way to do so:

Look in Aeries, find a student, demographics tab, mid-way down in ethnicity row is the "LangFlu." LF (Language Fluency) Code Key:

B = To Be Determined (they are new to California schools and need to be tested

E = (EO) English Only

F = (IFEP) Initially Fluent English Proficient (tested proficient on initial assessment, but may still need some assistance as many still struggle with academic language in your classrooms)

R = (RFEP) Reclassified Fluent English Proficient (these students tested proficient on the summative test and met other criteria to show proficiency, but will need monitoring and assistance along the way to make sure they do not fall through the cracks)

L = (EL or LTEL) English Learner or Long Term English Learner (these students need to be supported the most because they are still not considered proficient, especially the long term kiddos who do not seem to be improving every year like we should expect them to)

EL score levels for most state assessments can be found under the students info tab, test scores dropdown, then test scores (again) from that drop down. It will give you a quick snapshot of language fluency levels in the areas of reading, writing listening, and speaking.

- C- or better in English
- 2.0 + GPA
- Score of Proficient on DCA/Standard Nearly Met on ELA SBAC
- Parent Approval

You will receive emails from students' case managers to notify you about each student's IEP at a glance and any additional information needed to support the student.

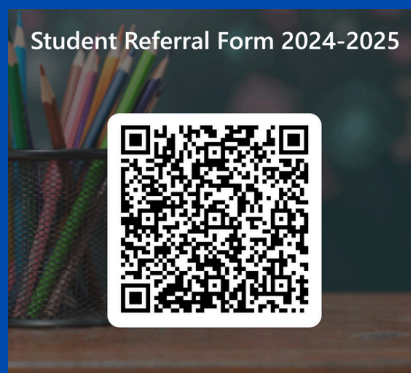

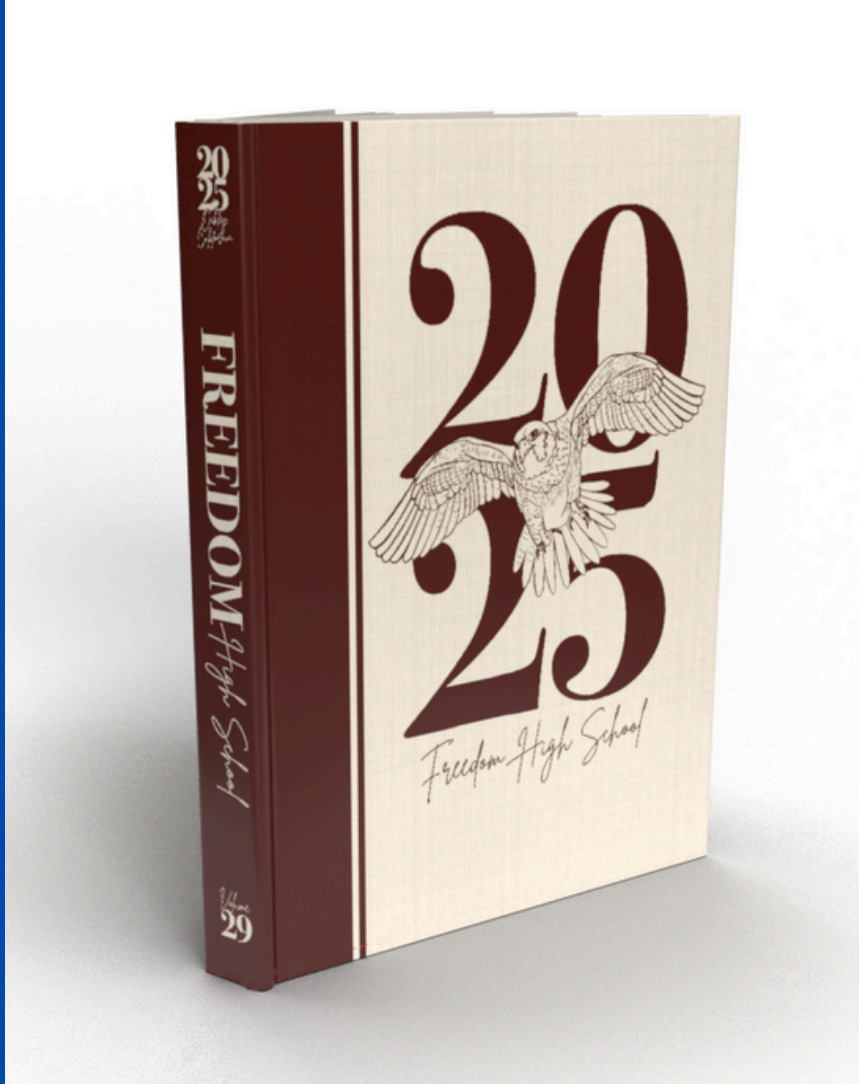
