## Study Suggestion

The way to study for this test is to read the question and read only the right answer. Do not look at the three wrong answers. Mark out the three wrong answers on your study guide, or on the question pool in your study book, or highlight the correct answer, so that, as you review the questions, you only look at the correct answer after reading the question. This is not memorization - it is association. You are associating the correct answer with the question. You don't need to know why that is the correct answer. The WHY will come later as you get experience with ham radio. All you need to know for taking the test is which answer is the correct answer. When you take the test and read the question, only one of the multiple choice answers will look familiar to you because that answer is the only answer of the group of four answers that you looked at, and that one will be the correct answer. It is a little bit spooky to take the test and have one of the answers jump out at you as the correct answer, but it works. I took my Extra test this way and did well - I passed.

As an adder to this method, if you take the practice tests, you will be looking at the three wrong answers as well as the correct answer as you take the practice test. So, taking the practice tests may diminish your ability to associate the correct answer with the question.
