 3. **Note: Your opinion can be based on events from the entire book, your example does not need to come from this week's reading.**

 - i. Once you have done that, review what your peers have posted and respond to two posts you find interesting. A valid response might include:
 1. Agreeing with the post and explaining with what it is you agree.
 2. Clarifying the post and explaining why the post needs clarification.
 3. Disagreeing with the post and explaining with what you disagree.
