Unit Overview

In this unit, we will be reading the Greek tragedy *Antigone* (pronounced an-TI-go-nee). This is a play that wrestles with the limitations and duties of the government and shows that humans are not meant to wield total power. In discussing this, we will explore how the characters in the play develop through interactions with one another and how these interactions reveal themes in the play.

Because of the limitations of distance learning, we will not be writing a full essay this quarter. Instead, you will be assigned shortened writing assignments at regular intervals over the next nine weeks.

Weekly Learning Targets

By the end of the week of April 6th - 10th, I should:

1. Understand how to receive and submit assignments using the distance learning model. (Assignments 1 and 2)
2. Be able to recognize foils in literature and understand why they are important. (Assignment 3)
3. Recognize the important traits of a tragic hero. (Assignment 4)
4. Understand the context of Antigone's background and the motivation of the major characters in the play. (Assignment 5 and 6)

Assignments

By 10:00 pm Friday April 10th, I should have completed and submitted the following assignments:

1. Mr. Cauley's Form of COVID Preparedness: Let's Get Ready for an Adventure!
 - a. This Google Form will give me valuable information about all of your distance learning situations. Please fill it out at the **beginning of the week** so that I can adjust my plans accordingly. [Here it is!](#)
2. Textbook: You will need access to **pages 267-366** in your textbook. You can find this [here](#), on clever, or on my website.
3. Foils
 - a. We will be talking a great deal about foils in this unit. This concept is explained in a presentation titled COVID foils. You can find this presentation [here](#) or download it directly from my website.
 - b. When you have gone through the entire presentation, you will be ready to participate in your first discussion board! You can find instructions for accessing the discussion board [here](#) or download them directly to my website.
 - c. For this assignment, you need to think about an example of a character foil you have seen in a book, movie, television show, or play. Then, create a post describing this foil and explaining why it is a good example.
4. Losers and Tragic Heroes
 - a. Although the play is named after Antigone, it actually depicts the downfall of a character named Creon. Creon represents a type of character called a Tragic Hero. Watch [this video](#) for an explanation of what this means.
 - b. You can also find information about Tragic Heroes on **page 299** in your textbook.
5. Oedipus Rex Video
 - a. Before you can understand Antigone, you must first become familiar with Oedipus. It was because of him and the consequence of his actions that the story of Antigone begins. Watch [this](#) video to familiarize yourself with this story.
 - b. After watching your video, go back to the discussion board to share your questions and ideas with your peers!
 - i. The first thing you need to do for this assignment is to post a question. Consider what you saw in the video and think of a good discussion question or insightful observation that you have and post it to the appropriate discussion.
 - ii. Once you have done that, you should review what your peers have posted. Find a post that you find interesting and respond to it. A valid response might include:
 1. Agreeing with the post and explaining with what it is you agree.
 2. Clarifying the post and explaining why the post needs clarification.
 3. Disagreeing with the post and explaining with what you disagree.
 - c. **Please be respectful when using the discussion board. Demeaning, off topic, or offensive posts will be deleted and the poster will receive a failing grade for the assignment.**
