J.W. (Jay) Anderson

Athlete

Football ~ Basketball ~ Baseball



Jay was awarded the Co-MVP Award in the 1948 Championship Season.

J.W. (Jay) Anderson attended Liberty High School from 1945 to 1949. He played football, basketball, and baseball for all four years he attended Liberty – earning Varsity letters for each sport from his sophomore through senior years. Jay was a member of the 1946 E.B.A.L. Championship football team that was coached by Coach Frank Vonder Ahe – that Championship team was inducted into the LUHSD Athletic Hall of Fame in 2012. In Jay's three years of varsity football, he played for three different head coaches. Frank Vonder Ahe in 1946, Troy Porterfield in 1947, and Lee Walker in 1948. Jay was an outstanding halfback on the 1948 E.B.A.L. Championship football team that went undefeated in league play. Jay was awarded the Co-Most Valuable Player Award for that championship season. In 2002, the 1948 football team, nicknamed the "49'ers," was inducted into the LUHSD Athletic Hall of Fame. After the disastrous 1947 season, this was truly a miracle! The Lions went 5-0 in league play, and they had a 5W-2L-1tie over an eight game season. The two losses were by a combined total of only 7 points.

Jay was a student leader while at Liberty. He was the Student Body President his senior year and a member of the Block "L" Society.

After graduation, Jay participated in various local community sports as well as for other teams in the county from 1950 through 1970. He played football, basketball, and softball. In 1950 and 1951, he played semi-pro football

with the Antioch Hornets. In 1951, he was chosen as the Hornets Outstanding Back. During and after World War II there were several semi-pro football teams playing in Northern California – Antioch, Martinez, and Santa Cruz, to name a few. It was a very competitive program that was on or very near the level of junior college football. Jay also played softball for the Antioch Merchants that traveled extensively. The team won two consecutive County Championships and became known as Antioch's "Boys of Summer."

Jay was employed by the Oakley Water District (Diablo Water District) after high school. He is the fourth individual from the Diablo Water District to be inducted into the LUHSD Athletic Hall of Fame. The three others are Leonard Celoni, Don Morse, and Paul Urenda Jr. Jay has passed away. He is lovingly survived by his wife, Marie, and three children, Ken, Karen and Kim.

Bill Chato

Athlete ~ Coach Football ~ Basketball ~ Baseball

Bill Chato certainly qualifies as one of the most outstanding and elite threesport athletes in the history of Liberty High School athletics. Bill lettered in football, basketball, and baseball as a freshman. As a sophomore he again lettered in all three sports and was selected for the MVP Basketball Player on the JV team. During Bill's junior year, he earned varsity letters in all three sports, and he was selected First Team All-League in baseball at first base. He also was the winner of the Best Hitter Award for the Liberty team. During Bill's senior year at Liberty, 1967-68, Bill was selected All-E.B.A.L. in the three major sports; he was selected All-League in football as a defensive line backer, All-League guard in basketball, and All-League at first base in baseball. He was also honored by winning Liberty's Outstanding Lineman Award in football. He was selected for the Most Valuable Basketball Player Award. He also was selected for the Most Valuable Baseball Player Award. Bill finished his senior year by winning the prestigious "Yearbook Award," which is awarded to the Outstanding Senior Athlete. Besides winning trophies and letters, Bill was honored by being selected by McClymonds High School to their All-Opponents Team, and he was also honored to be selected to the All-Tourney Team at the Rio Vista Basketball Tournament.

While at Liberty, Bill was also a fine student and student leader – he was the Rotary Club Student of the Month, Block "L" Society President, and he was awarded the Associated Students' Leadership Award.

Bill continued his education at Humboldt State University in Arcata, California, where he lettered for four years on the varsity football team where his intensity and tough play earned him the nickname "Mad Dog." Some of his awards at H.S.U. are: the "Special Blanket Award," given only to 4-year consecutive letter award winners; the "Scout Award," the "Mr. Hustle Award" for 2 consecutive years (1970 and 1971); and in 1970 the "Player of the Week Award." Bill was not only an excellent football player but also a fine student and was honored as a member of Epsilon Pi Tau Honor Fraternity, 1968 to 1972.

Upon graduating from H.S.U., Bill began a teaching and coaching career in the Cutler-Orosi Unified School District in Dinuba, California. Bill has coached, taught and counseled three generations of families and children: 38 years at the Cutler-Orosi Unified School District. Just as you might suspect, Bill has done it all – coached and taught football, basketball, baseball, track, tennis, taught physical education and served as an Athletic Director.

Bill recently retired after 38 years of dedicated service. He and his wife, Valerie, live in Dinuba, California, and have one daughter, Charlene.

Kate Dwelley Athlete

Swimming



Kate broke team records in every individual event she swam for two consecutive years.

Kate Dwelley entered Liberty High School as a freshman in 2003 having just placed 8th at the USA Olympic Trials. To call her a phenomenon would be an understatement. This was just the starting point of a high school career that was filled with setting records and championships. In her freshman year, she broke school records in every individual event she was in and did not lose an individual race the entire season including NCS where she took first place in the 200 and 500 freestyle events. Her times earned her a place on the NISCA High School All American Team. She also earned accolades as a student athlete and was named a USA Academic All American. Kate's sophomore year was a repeat of her freshman year. After her NCS winning performances in the 200 and 500 freestyle events, she was named as a Contra Costa Times Female Athlete of the Year finalist. She once again earned a spot on the NISCA All American Team. Although just a sophomore, Kate began to emerge as a team leader and role model for the entire Liberty team. As a high school junior, Kate once again continued to break records and win races. Her team leadership and enthusiasm was boundless and she propelled Liberty High Women's Swim Team to a BVAL title and a 7th Place finish at NCS, the highest finish ever recorded for Liberty. She won the 100 Freestyle at NCS and broke the NCS 200 Freestyle record while once again taking first place. She was listed as one of the fastest female high school swimmers in the Nation and named the Contra Costa Times Swimmer of the Year. Kate capped off her senior year at Liberty in the same winning ways. Once again she broke team records in every individual event she swam. Her hard work and dedication to the sport paid off at NCS where she broke the NCS records in the 100 Freestyle (49.46), the 200 Freestyle (1:45.96), and an unprecedented third individual record in the

50 Freestyle as the lead-off leg of the 200 Freestyle Relay (22.97). These swims set her apart from any other female swimmer. Kate had some of the fastest swims in the Nation. She was named Liberty's MVP, BVAL Female Swimmer of the Year, Contra Costa Times Swimmer of the Year, and the 2007 NorCal Prep Female Athlete of the Year. The highlights of Kate's career at Liberty include winning every individual event she swam for all four years, and she holds 7 out of 8 individual Liberty Team records as well as being part of all three record holding relay teams. She was 4-time BVAL 1st Team, 18-time High School All American, 3-time Contra Costa Times Athlete of the Year finalist, 2-time Contra Costa Times Female Swimmer of the Year, and 2007 NorCal Prep Female Athlete of the Year. She graduated from Liberty as one of the top students in her class and was awarded a full-ride swimming scholarship to Stanford.

Kate made her mark while competing at Stanford. She helped lead Stanford to four Top-4 finishes at the NCAA's between 2008 and 2011. Her 4-year Stanford swimming career included being a 24-time NCAA All-American, 3-time Academic All PAC-10, PAC-10 Champion in the 200 Freestyle for 3 years, PAC-10 Champion in the 100 Freestyle and 200 Freestyle Relays, breaking the Stanford Team Records in the 200 Freestyle, 200, 400, and 800 Freestyle Relays, American Record holder in the 400 Free Relay, NCAA 400 Freestyle Relay Champion, and Stanford Team Captain for her Junior and Senior years. In 2009 Kate received the prestigious Jenny Thompson Award. Her Stanford career ended in 2011 with awards as the Most Valuable Stanford Swimmer as well as the Stanford Athletic Conference Athlete of the Year.

Kate was also kept busy when she wasn't competing for Liberty and Stanford. She was an integral part of the USA Swim scene. She was on the USA National Team in 2004, 2007, and 2011. She participated in the USA World University Games in 2007 and in 2011 where she was named the Team Captain. In 2008 she was 9th at the Olympic Trials, and she ended her competitive career in 2012 placing 9th at the Olympic Trials in her premier event, the 200 Freestyle.

Kate is currently living in Palo Alto and attending graduate school at Stanford. She plans to get her teaching credential.

Amy Foreman Gerace

Athlete ~ Coach Soccer ~ Softball

Amy Foreman Gerace attended Liberty Union High School from 1990-1994. During those four years, Amy was an outstanding athlete, scholar, and leader on the campus. After graduating in 1994, she attended Diablo Valley College and then Cal State Hayward where she earned a BS degree in business administration and marketing and a MS degree in kinesiology. She currently serves as the Head Women's Soccer Coach at Cal State East Bay in Hayward. She is in her 13th year.

In high school, Amy was a two-sport letter winner in soccer and softball. She was the MVP of the JV softball team, but it was in soccer that she really excelled. She earned the All-League award in 1992 and was the Girls' Soccer Team Captain in 1993. She was a member of the first LUHS girls' soccer team that competed in NCS League action in 1990, and she was a member of the Liberty softball teams that participated in NCS tournaments in 1992 and 1993. Amy was awarded the "LUHS Female Scholar Athlete of the Year" in 1994.

Amy was very active in school activities and leadership. She was on Honor Roll, in Block "L", Pep Club, on the Homecoming Court, and FNL Club. She was a Student Council Representative, Junior Class Treasurer, and Block "L" Secretary. She even served as a manager for the varsity football team. She was selected as Student of the Month for the Social Studies and PE Departments.

After high school, Amy was a member of Diablo Valley College's Women's Soccer Team from 1994-1996. She then transferred to Cal State Hayward where she lettered for two years on the CSUH Pioneer Women's Soccer Team. In 1996 she was named to the All-NCAC Second Team – defender, and in 1997 she was safe to the All-NCAC Second Team – defender, and in 1997 she was safe to the All-NCAC Second Team – defender.

she was named to the All-NCAC Second Team – defender, and in 1997 she was selected as the CSUH Team Captain.

Amy went to coach at Cal State East Bay from Chabot College, where she served as an assistant coach from 1999-2000 and spent one season as the Gladiators' Athletic Coordinator. She was also an assistant coach at LUHS from 1996-2000. During this time, Liberty made their first post-season appearance, making it to the NCS quarterfinals.

Amy is currently completing her 13th year as head coach of the Cal State East Bay Women's Soccer Team and has accumulated over 80 victories while guiding the Pioneers to the four 10-win seasons. She has mentored many athletes to All-American status and many other awards, but the highlight of her coaching career was in 2011. The Pioneers had its best season at the Division II level since 1988 when CSU Hayward won a national championship. Amy is a member of the NSCAA (National Soccer Coaches Association of America).

Monique Renslow Lewis

Athlete Diving



Monique was the first Liberty diver to ever win the league championship.

Monique Renslow Lewis entered Liberty High School in 1988 and became a standout diver unlike any other in the history of Liberty High Women's Swimming. As a freshman, Monique took the DFAL by storm when she became the first Liberty diver to ever win the league championship. She went on to place 2nd at the North Coast Section Meet that year. This was the highest achievement any Liberty High School diver, male or female, had ever placed at NCS. Her sophomore year of diving had similar results as once again she was the DFAL Women's Diving Champion. She placed third at the NCS meet. As a junior, Monique continued her winning ways and placed first once again at the DFAL Championship Meet. This was the year that she made Liberty High history by being the first Liberty High diver to become the North Coast Section Champion. Her score of 388.10 points still stands as a Liberty High School Diving Record. She was also named a High School All-American Diver that year. Unfortunately, Monique was injured and underwent surgery after her junior year so she was unable to compete her senior year.

During her tenure at Liberty, Monique was recognized for her academic excellence as a student athlete and received Liberty High Scholar Athlete Awards all three years as well as being recognized as a Scholar

Athlete by the North Coast Section. She earned her Varsity Letter for diving all three years, was First Team All-League, and broke the Liberty High Women's Varsity Diving records.

Diving is a sport that combines discipline, strength and coordination along with hours upon hours of practice. Monique had the personal fortitude and perseverance to become the best diver Liberty High School has ever had. She was a member of the U.S. Diving Team from the time she was 12 years old and placed 12th in the Nation as a U.S. Jr. Olympic Diver when she was a freshman in high school.

After graduating in 1992, Monique continued her education at Brigham Young University. Currently she resides in Johnstown, Colorado with her husband Christopher and her children. She is a professional photographer who owns and operates Monique Lewis Photography.

Alana Roderick Knowles

Athlete Volleyball ~ Basketball ~ Softball

Alana entered Liberty High School in 1979 with outstanding credentials from Knightsen Elementary School where she was the Outstanding Female Athlete and the Outstanding Academic Student of her class. That certainly portended a bright and outstanding future at Liberty, and it certainly happened!

Alana played three sports at Liberty, but she chose to concentrate on only two after her sophomore year. As a frosh, she lettered in JV volleyball, JV basketball and JV softball, and she was named the Outstanding Defensive Player of the softball team. In the fall of 1980, Alana was the only sophomore to make the varsity volleyball team where she earned her first varsity letter. She also played varsity basketball and earned her varsity letter. She moved up to varsity softball and played and lettered on the team that won a North Coast Section berth. As a junior, Alana made the decision to concentrate on just two sports – volleyball and softball. She was a leader on the volleyball team that won the F.A.L. Championship, and she then lettered in softball on a team that also won the F.A.L. Championship and earned a North Coast Section berth.

Her senior year was a repeat of her successful junior year. On the volleyball team she was selected the Most Valuable Player; she was chosen to the F.A.L. 1st Team All-League; she was Team Captain, as well. On the 1983 varsity softball team, she was selected as the Defensive Player of the Year; she was the Parker-

Robb F.A.L. Player of the Week; she was Second Team All-League and Co-Captain of the team. Coach Linda Ghilarducci said of Alana's volleyball prowess, "Alana would be an asset to any college volleyball program." Coach Jerry Miller praised her softball skill and leadership during her senior season, "She is one of the key players of our team. A lot of the girls look up to her. She had a super season last year and was one of the keys to our winning streak that put us in position to win the league last year." To make Alana's outstanding four-year athletic career at Liberty even more sweet – she was selected to receive the prestigious "Yearbook Award" presented to the Outstanding Senior Female Athlete of 1982-83.

Alana was also active in student government – she was the Junior Class Vice-President, and she was elected Liberty High School Student Body President her senior year. She also received other accolades: she was a Brentwood Rotary Student of the Month; she received the Daughters of the American Revolution Good Citizen Award; and she was a California Scholastic Federation Lifetime Member.

In 1983, Alana received Honors at entrance to C.S.U. Sacramento. She graduated from C.S.U. Sacramento with a Bachelor of Science in 1987. She was hired by Chevron and married to Roger Knowles. They have two children, Kellee and Derek, and still live in Brentwood.

The 2000 Liberty Boy's Golf Team

Coached by Alex Aiello

The 2000 Liberty High School Boy's Golf Team has, without a doubt, distinguished itself as one of the most elite athletic groups to have competed in the Liberty Union High School District. Led by Coach Alex Aiello, and comprised of a deep and talented collection of golfers, this team's accomplishments set a standard that has yet to be surpassed by any high school boy's golf team not only in the Liberty District, but in far eastern Contra Costa County as well.

After achieving a 17-1 dual match record in BVAL competition, the 2000 team went on to claim a league title by topping rival De La Salle High School at the BVAL tournament held at Paradise Valley GC. Four team members were awarded 1st Team All-BVAL honors: Zach Spinuzzi, Jay Westerlund, Brian Sosine, and Ryan Ortiz. The Lions then went on to win the North Coast Section Championship tournament at The Bridges GC, beating perennial NCS powerhouse Monte Vista High School by one stroke, thereby making this Liberty team and the 1987 Antioch team the only schools in far eastern Contra Costa County to have achieved this feat. This team then went on to place 3rd at the CIF State Championship tournament held at The Salinas Golf & CC, finishing only behind nationally renowned R.L. Stevinson High School of Pebble Beach and Central Coast power Serra High School.

Led by team MVP's and Co-Captains Zach Spinuzzi and Jay Westerlund, the 2000 squad also captured 1st place in three other tournaments in which they competed: the Joe Gambetta Invitational, the prestigious Sal V. Aeillo Invitational at Discovery Bay CC, and the Liberty Classic at Brentwood GC, where they set an 18-hole team scoring record of 368. This team also lowered the school dual match team scoring record 5 times, with the low score being an outstanding 183.

Another outstanding element of this team is that they were recognized as a NCS Distinguished Academic Team with a total GPA of 3.0 +, and, without exception, the members have left Liberty High School and gone on to achieve academic or professional success. What they have accomplished stands out as one of Liberty's outstanding athletic feats of all time, and for this reason, the Liberty Union High School District Athletic Hall of Fame is proud and honored to induct the 2000 Liberty High School Boy's Golf Team into the Athletic Hall of Fame.
